

## Don't Worry, Be Happy




Our ROC Top Tip is to be happy & don't forget to smile; people want to work with happy people!

#### The WAM Test




Pen and paper this... Work, Accommodation, Money – write down the pros and cons for each when considering a new role





# Focus on the questions & your answers




Listen to the questions carefully and answer them confidently but remember to be concise, do not go into a full life story!





# Failing to prepare, is preparing to fail




Research the company and job thoroughly. Show you have used your initiative to find out something about the organisation





#### Be on time. No Excuses.




Ensure you have the correct time & location and arrive 15 minutes early; rushing may make you nervous & flustered

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## Know who you're meeting




Have the name of the person(s) you're meeting, know their status in the company and a bit about their own background – *LinkedIn* is a great resource for this!

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## Don't forget the basics




Have the address & telephone number of the company to hand, map the office location & know the nearest station or parking facilities

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## Find a willing ear and rehearse!




Plan and go through some questions & answers to test out how a few things sound, but find someone who'll be honest with you






## Everyone get's nervous, it's natural



Breathe, be prepared & know your own CV (you'll be asked about you, nothing else). Sip water to take a break and gather your thoughts.

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#### **Dress for Success!**




First impressions really count. Dress professionally. When in doubt, wear a suit or ask your recruitment consultant for input.





## Bring a pen and paper




Have a pen and paper ready to note any questions, ideas or points to remember or raise later in the interview.






## Be composed and speak clearly



Speak clearly and slowly. Vary your tone, be enthusiastic & sound interested when answering questions. *How* you say things matters just as much as *what* you say.

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## Interview 'development' is a must




In 2nd interviews, you must show development - don't repeat material from 1st interview; show that you can learn & improve





## No Smoking before interviews!

THIS WAY






If you smoke, whatever you do, do not smoke right before an interview regardless of if you think it will 'calm your nerves'





#### The Handshake




No 'limp fish' handshakes! Make sure you greet your interviewer with a firm handshake, eye contact and a smile.






#### Not all communication is verbal

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## Your personal story




Do you have 1-2 stories that are unique to you that can help you relate to, move or inspire the people you meet?






## Don't be afraid to sell yourself



The job market is pretty competitive – remember to sell yourself. If you're not asked about something that you feel is important, raise the subject yourself.

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#### The Elevator Pitch



A very handy tool – picture what you would say if given only the time it takes to ride in an elevator with someone... Your background; why you want the role; why you'd be great at it.

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## Be passionate




Be passionate when selling yourself in interviews. If you can't get excited about your fit for the role, how can they?





## Be a good listener




Show that you're listening attentively: nod, lean towards the interviewer & display a genuine interest in what they are saying





## Prepare 2-3 questions in advance




Most interviews end with, "do you have any questions?" Don't miss an opportunity to show you've got some intelligent questions





## The importance of questions




Sharp, relevant questions will show you're interested, proactive and that you're making sure this is the right role for you





### Know your own CV




Be familiar with your CV, your experience and achievements to date and be prepared to answer any questions about these tips





## Competency & Skill based answers

#### THE COMPLETE ANSWER




Let your answers illustrate your achievements, what skills these show, relevant experience & suitability for the role. Give evidence of past performance and achievements.





## Competency & skill-based answers





Use past experiences and achievements to illustrate your skills and competencies. Explain how these show you would be excellent for the new role.





### Buzz Words, but in balance



Use words and phrases like: Ability to Learn, Energy, Take Pride, Target Driven, Passionate, Responsibility, Resilient, Achievements





## The "STAR" approach to answering



When answering with an example from past experience, explain the situation, what task was involved, what you did and the result.





#### The structure of most interviews



Your introduction. Their introduction. Rapport Building. Question and Answering. Objection Handling. Qualify the role.





## Stay Positive!




You'll be asked why you're leaving your current role so be prepared & remain complimentary about your previous employer.





## **Keep Staying Positive**




If you don't get a position, make mistakes or don't 'click' with the interviewer, don't worry it happens, move on.





## Think before you answer. Don't rush.




Listen to a question. Pause for a few seconds to think, then answer. Your answers are 100 times better when you do this!





## Take a sip to take a pause




In interviews you'll talk a lot, and if nerves creep in, your mouth might get dry, so ask for water at the start. It's a great way to give yourself a pause if you are getting nervous.



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#### How to end an interview



After asking your questions, declare your interest for the role and ask what the next steps will be.





#### Show an active interest in the role




Follow up within a few days to ask any further questions and reiterate your interest in the role.





### Build rapport. It's essential.




Attempt to build rapport with the interviewer; tell them your background and ask about theirs. Don't give your life story though!





## Tops tips for presentations in interviews






Follow the brief (ask questions before if you have them); Speak clearly & confidently; don't just read off slides; have printouts; engage with the audience;

manage your time!

Break Into these sections: Intro & Concept, Sales & Marketing, Financials, close "The Deal"





## The structure for presentations at interviews




Start: Introduction of yourself & Agenda. Middle: Substance, your case, details & facts. End: Conclude, allow questions & summarise





## You won't be discussing rocket science (unless you are a scientist)




The interviewer will ask questions about <u>you!</u> Open up and be prepared to talk about yourself. It's a subject you know well!





### "Bouncebackability"




You won't get every role you go for, those that can pick themselves up and learn from their mistakes go on to succeed





#### Interview "Match Report"



Always do a "Match Report": follow each interview with writing notes on what works and what doesn't, no matter the outcome.





### Handling a job offer




If offered the position you want, accept! If you want to think about it set a definite date when you can give an answer.






#### Meeting the team – often a good sign!



If at the end of the interview they bring you around to meet others in the office it could be a rapport building test, chat with them ask about their job and what they do.



#### One stage interview? Be cautious...




Depending on the role, a one-stage interview might seem a bit quick to make a decision – for both you and the employer. Don't rush into a decision. Think about it for a day or two and ask questions!

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# Compare on opportunity, not just money




Weigh up everything: Salary, Cost of living, Commute, Social scene, and most importantly: Do you like the role? Will it help progress your career in the direction you want?
